## ARCHITECTURAL CALL FOR TENDER

The call for tender launched in January to select the architect to work on the creation of the future Franco-British Visitors' Centre was extremely successful receiving 134 candidacies from across Europe: UK, Italy, The Netherlands, Belgium, etc.

PHILEAS, DUNCAN LEWIS and JOHN LAMPROS are the three candidates chosen to go through to the next round of the tender.

The jury to select the winning architectural group will meet on July 13th. The town council will then have a much clearer vision of how the Centre will look both from an architectural and scenographical perspective.

## THE EU INTERREG PROGRAMME France(Channel) England

In the general framework of transregional cooperation, the European France (Channel) England INTERREG programme enables and encourages the development of strong partnerships with our British neighbours.

One of the axes of the programme, on which joint projects may be developed, highlights the natural and cultural attractiveness of the cross-Channel region involved. Ouistreham Town Council therefore intends to develop a project for cross-Channel cooperation with an English partner with a view to establishing a network of specialists (academic, tourism, cultural...), who will work together over a number of months so as to provide a vision of joint themes to be illustrated within the future Franco-British Visitors' Centre.
